1 In the United States, there used to be a law that it prohibited the sale of alcohol.

2 An inflation rate of only 20% make a difference to experts.

3 Some members of the transport commission suggested that lowering the speed limit on the road would not necessarily result in less accidents.

4 Students have until May at the latest to decide whether they wish to audit regular classes during the summer or whether they intend to do an internship in a company or organization relating to their major.

5 It is essential that we all will listen to what our coach has to say about the big game.

6 And, while studio executives spend considerably more time thinking about box office returns rather than public diplomacy, Tinseltown is actually pretty effective at nudging America's international image in a positive direction.

7 Scarcely I had entered the room when several students rushed over to me and told me the startling and worrying news about my best friend's car accident, in which he injured both of his arms and legs.

8 My father, curious and alert what he was to new technology, does not appear to have investigated the operating system of the machine. 9 Growing up in a factory town, where he saw how workers were subjected to the hardships of life as the working poor, left him with a real sense that some things were lacked to be set right.

10 When it comes to learning a foreign language, nothing is more important trying to find suitable opportunities to use the language.

11 Art, for Morris, was part of life --- not the domain of the rich elite: "I do not want art for a few any fewer than education for a few or freedom for a few.

16 It is true that Hollywood isn't popular everywhere. In particular, it has limited appeal in some predominantly Muslim nations. Among 20 countries that surveyed by Pew Research, the only four where majorities said they do not like American movies, music, and TV were Pakistan, Turkey, Egypt, and Jordan.

17 The word "science" once meant knowledge of any department of learning. Not until the nineteenth century its meaning tended to be restricted to the systematic study of the natural world. Early scientists were usually called "natural philosophers."

18 All I hear in the stillness of the night is the ticking of a clock. The better I try to ignore it, the more clearly it seems to fall on my ears.

19 Even with about 150 people taking samples across the state and the help of satellites and sensors buried in the ground, it's a highly uncertain way estimating the water supply for a thirsty state, where every drop is precious and expensive to move.

20 He revised the badly written essay extensively. It is still not perfect, but it is certainly much more imperfect.

21 Were universities increase their number of offered courses, students would benefit from the wider selection and smaller classes.

22 Some claim that it is the local police that are causing the violence by firing guns at stone-throwing crowds. The organizers of the protests say that would be fairly peaceful if they should have handled less harshly.

30 The president of the auto company finally decided to resign after being criticized for months by the media and the public for the way which he managed the company.

31 As well as we adopt the correct policies and measures in a timely and decisive manner to seize opportunities and cope with challenges, we will definitely be able to maintain stable and fairly fast economic growth.

32 Atmospheric gases, especially carbon dioxide, are already generating extreme weather conditions, included powerful hurricanes and floods, which have recently affected the Western Balkans.

33 The end of the First World War was accompanied by unmistakable evidences that the majority of Irish people had no intention of remaining a part of the United Kingdom.

34 Now an international team of scientists believe they have found a way to convert A, B and AB blood types into O-type, and making it safe to use in transfusions. Professor Martin Olsson of Lund University Hospital in Sweden is one of the report's authors.
